Sun Safety at School - As a school, we want to protect staff and pupils from sunburn, and therefore believe that by encouraging sun safe behaviour at school and teaching children about the risks of sunlight, we can prevent them burning. The school would like your help and support in this matter. We will be encouraging children to avoid sunburn and overexposure to the sun by:

- Seeking the shade, particularly during the middle of the day
- Wearing suitable hats
- Wearing clothing that protects the skin, particularly for outdoor activities and school trips
- Using a high factor sunscreen

You can help by encouraging your child to bring, and wear, a hat at school. Sun creams provide added protection and we do encourage you to apply sun cream before coming to school. We also encourage all parents to provide a bottle of sun cream that can be used in school with your child's name clearly identified. Children will not be allowed to share bottles of sun cream. Whenever possible, teachers will supervise the application of sun cream. Sometimes it may be necessary for teachers or support staff to help children apply the sun cream.

If your child has any allergies or skin sensitivities, you may want to check with your GP before providing a sun cream. The school will inform you if your child has any adverse reaction that may be due to the sun cream, and will take medical advice if necessary.

Bagels in the Morning – Wow, the take-up of the daily morning bagel has been extraordinary and has exceeded our expectations. The children are telling us that they love them and look forward to coming to get one. It is with the dedicated support of many staff that we have been able to provide as many bagels each morning (over 400!) as we have. MAD Week is Coming! - The week following half term will be our MAD (Music, Art and Dance) Week. The children will be involved in lots of exciting activities, working with experts in the fields of art, music and dance. Please do talk to your child about the exciting activities they will be taking part in. You will all be invited to see the amazing work we produce on Friday 7th June at 3.30pm – so put the date in your calendar and be prepared to be amazed!.

Alice in Wonderland Performance – As a school, we believe it is really important that children are given the opportunity to take part in a high quality theatrical performance, as it builds confidence and gives children a chance to shine on a stage.
