

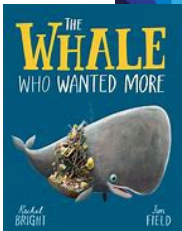


SUMMER TERM 2024



Literacy

Projects will be based on the stories below.



- Children will be focusing on finding and writing their name.
- Introduction to phonics and learning letter sounds.

Maths

Pupils will cover the following units this half term:

- Counting past 5
- Recognising numerals to 5
- Fast recognition of objects up to 5 without counting.

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Communication and language

- Develop their communication, but may continue to have problems with irregular tenses and plurals, such as 'runned' for 'ran', 'swimmed' for 'swam'.
- Use talk to organise themselves and their play: "Let's go on a bus... you sit there... I'll be the driver."
- Be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or a friend, using words as well as actions.

Home Learning

Books will be sent home weekly to share at home. Please remember to return these.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Find solutions to conflicts and rivalries. For example, accepting that not everyone can be Spider-Man in the game, and suggesting other ideas.
- Remember rules without needing an adult to remind them.
- Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas.



Physical development

- Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips.
- Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.



Understanding the World

- Talk about what they see, using a wide vocabulary.
- Begin to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and all living things.



Expressive Arts and Design

- Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details.
- Play instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas.
